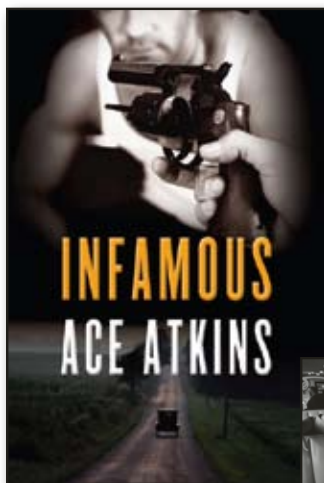


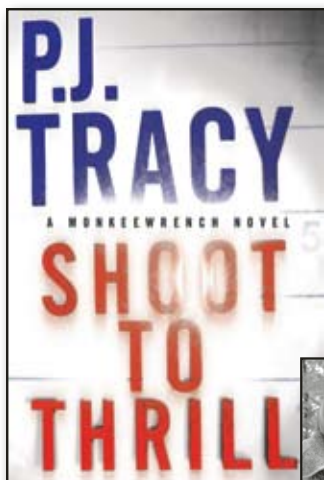
In **NOWHERE TO RUN**, the tenth gripping Joe Pickett thriller by C.J. Box, which G.P. Putnam's Sons will publish on April 6, 2010 (\$25.95), Wyoming Game Warden Joe Pickett is in his last week of his temporary post in the isolated town of Baggs, WY. He is about to be relieved of this position and sent back to his family who he has sorely missed. But there have been strange things going on in the surrounding mountains on his watch, and his conscience won't let him leave without checking them out. What Joe finds in those mountains, on unfamiliar and dangerous ground, is like nothing he's ever dealt with before. Except in one way—the threat that is posed is extremely deadly. And this time, even Joe may not possess the skills needed to contain it.

C. J. Box is the author of ten Joe Pickett novels and two stand-alones, and has won the Edgar, Anthony, Macavity, Gumshoe, and Barry awards, as well as the French Prix Calibre .38 and the French Elle magazine literary award. Putnam's Sons will publish on April 15, 2010 (\$25.95), is Ace Atkins's new historical crime thriller set in the midst of the Great Depression and Prohibition—the golden age of the gangster. Machine Gun Kelly and his conniving wife, Kathryn, conspire to get rich and make history. The Kellys plotted the kidnapping of wealthy oil tycoon Charles Urschel, they planned out every detail...but they didn't count on a smart victim who would help lead the Feds right to their door. After Urschel's kidnapping, the Kellys spent 56 days on the run, crisscrossing the United States while the FBI unleashed one of the biggest manhunts in its history. As they attempt to outrace and outwit their pursuers, the Kellys feel the net tighten, as they come closer and closer to their date with infamy.

Ace Atkins is the author of eight novels. He also is a former journalist who was nominated for a Pulitzer Prize for his investigation of an unsolved 1950s murder. He is the author of the successful Nick Travers series, as well as the true-crime-based White Shadow, Wicked City and Devil's Garden. Atkins lives on a historic farm outside Oxford, Mississippi with his family.

The fifth in the wildly popular series opens on a sweltering summer day in Minneapolis. Homicide detectives Leo Magozzi and Gino Rolseth think they've seen it all. So when they get a call about a bride found dead in the shallows of the Mississippi River, it seems like just another day on the job. But when the Monkeewrench crew—a team of eccentric software programmers, now assisting the FBI to investigate a string of murder videos popping up all over the Web—discover a video of the bride's murder online, Magozzi and Rolseth realize they're up against something bigger and more horrifying than they've ever encountered before.

P.J. Tracy is the pseudonym of the mother-daughter writing team of Patricia Lambrecht and Traci Lambrecht, winner of the Anthony, Barry, Gumshoe, and Minnesota Book Awards.
